

Fans of English writer Robert Browning will want to attend the Los Angeles premiere stage version of the writer's accliamed novel "The Ring And The Book".

Published in 1868, the story exposed a tale of violence in the 17th century in which a noble man shocked the citizens of Rome, when he murdered his wife and her adopted parents. Browning created poetic dramatic monologues for each of the trial participants taken from the actual Old Yellow Book legal records.

Directed by Brenda Urquhart, Browning's The Ring and The Book unmasks the highly sensationalized murder trial in 1697 Rome.

During the trial jurors heard that Mrs Basuta, who ran a day care centre, had lost her temper with Oliver after he refused to stop watching television in order to have his nappy changed.

The prosecution said that she slammed him to the ground, and he died the following day of massive head injuries.

Basuta, who has always maintained her innocence, was left distraught by the guilty verdict, which was announced in June.

Her lawyers say the trial judge refused to

allow important evidence to be heard.

They claim that the child had a previous head injury, but say they were not allowed to cross-examine experts in court on how that might have led to his death.

Mrs Basuta says Oliver had been pushed over on a brick patio whilst playing with other children, as she was changing the nappy on another child.

She and her husband, along with their three children, have lived in California for 10 years since she left her job as a nurse in Berkshire.
